Rule 4354 - New Requirements

New Requirements for Glass Melting Furnaces

On December 16, 2021, the San Joaquin Valley Air Pollution Control District (District) amended District Rule 4354 - Glass Melting Furnaces. The purpose of this rule is to limit emissions of nitrogen oxides (NOx), carbon monoxide (CO), volatile organic compounds (VOC), oxides of sulfur (SOx), and particulate matter from glass melting furnaces. The approved amendments lower the NOx and particulate matter emission limits for container and flat glass melting furnaces, and also lower SOx emission limits for container glass furnaces. The rule requires the following actions by the dates specified in the table below:

	not later than June 1, 2028	2030, whichever is sooner
